

LUNCHEON FOR SERBIANS.

Royal Mission Is Entertained by U. N. Bethell.

The royal Serbian Mission was entertained yesterday at luncheon at the Bankers Club by U. N. Bethell, Senior Vice President of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company. After the luncheon the party went to the Telephone and Telegraph Building at 195 Broadway for a transcontinental telephone demonstration over lines equipped with the invention of Professor Pupin, Serbian Consul General at New York, who was one of the party.

The head of the mission, Dr. Milenko Vesnitch, delivered an address to the Yougo Slav Committee in San Francisco over the long-distance telephone, and received in return a greeting from the committee, with the assurance that all the Southern Slavs of the Pacific Coast will work and fight alongside of Serbia for their common liberation and unification.
